


An awareness drive for adolescent girls was conducted at a rural area- Anuru, to educate school girls about Menstruation by the staff and students of ACOP. The initiation of the program was carried stating that all menstruation is normal and shouldn't be considered as a sickness or to be kept in secret. 





The speaker deliberated her thought saying PCOD is a hormonal imbalance that interferes with a woman's reproductive system. She stated that Public awareness of PCOS is necessary because over half of the 10,000,000 people that have it, are unaware of it and awareness could help understand that symptoms like irregular periods and pelvic pain are not something to be ignored and getting it checked is necessary. She suggested for dietary changes for PCOD like reducing Sugars and Carbohydrates. She vocalized speaking that many women with PCOD also have insulin resistance, in which the body doesn't use the hormone insulin effectively. 


